Agriculture & Food Processing Industry: general

Food production has become a complicated system. No longer do people consume foodstuffs that are largely sourced locally and consumed in season. Now food is produced and processed in one part of the world, frozen and flown to the other side of the globe, where juggernauts take it to huge edge-of-town supermarkets where it is kept in arrays of refrigerated shelving before it arrives eventually in the final consumer's home, usually after yet another road journey.

The food itself has undergone many transformation since it left the farm gate, creating products that are more processed, refined and chemically flavoured, coloured and preserved as well as packaged than ever before in history. The

variety of foodstuffs produced by this process is deceptive since close study of the ingredients usually reveals the same small set of cheap ingredients disguised by intensive technological manipulation. There is no need to romanticise past patterns of eating — food adulteration was, for example, a severe problem in the 19th century—to recognise that the present food processing system is bad for the health of both people and environment.
